Lake Steward's Update

This year the ice came off the lake around April 15th compared with March 31st the previous year. From January to the end of August this year, we received 27.8 inches of precipitation. We only had 24.5 during the same period last year.

We, along with the staff from RVCA, have been continuing water quality testing this year. 2023 is the 5th year in RVCA's testing cycle, which means they were testing even more sites than usual. I'm happy to say the lake is still very healthy.

Bald Eagle on Otter Lake

One of the many things I miss about our home in BC are the Bald Eagles (12 at one time) that would sit in the dead Douglas Fir in our back yard. Imagine my surprise to hear that we have a bald eagle pair nesting in a tree on an island here in our Otter Lake!! I was worried they might try for the baby loons that are born here, but recent research says that lakes with bald eagles tend to have more baby loons - something about the abundance of fish for both predators.

So, I was sitting on my dock this week (July, 2023) and saw this one sitting in a dead Eastern White Pine just 100 feet across from me on a little peninsula (O6)!! I grabbed my camera with a 1200mm lens (for comparison, the iPhones have a 13, 26 and 52mm lens), and sat for 30 min waiting for it to take off. I managed three shots that were not so bad.







Otters

At our last Annual General Meeting (AGM), one of our members commented on the fact that we rarely talk about otters, our lake's namesake. This prompted me to do some research.

Our otters are North American River Otters. Depending on the source, their scientific name is either Lutra canadensis or Lontra canadensis with the former version being more popular.

According to Wikipedia, adult otters can weigh between 5 and 14 kg with the males being at the higher end of this range. Their length ranges from 66 to 107 centimetres with about a third of that being the long, tapered tail. The average otter can live from 8 to 13 years in the wild. The river otter's main diet is fish although they also consume amphibians, shellfish and other animals.

The Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora (CITES) lists North American river otters as "Threatened" although other sources indicate that the population in Eastern Ontario has remained reasonably stable since the early 1950's.

I spoke to some people around the lake about their experiences with otters. For the most part, that experience was positive. The main exception being the mess they sometimes leave on docks. People talked about enjoying the antics of the otters, especially in winter when they are seen playing along the shore and on the ice. Occasionally they will even make ice slides to add to their fun.

My first experience with otters here was the early spring of 2019. The ice had started to break up and three otters were diving off the ice floes to catch fish which they would bring up onto the ice to devour. I can personally attest to them having very good appetites!


